CHILD DEATH INVESTIGATIONS DURING STATE FISCAL YEAR 2018

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is a preliminary report on child deaths that were reported to local departments of social services (LDSS) and investigated during State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2018. This report highlights changes or trends from previous years. It also includes a synopsis of data for all child abuse or neglect fatalities for SFY 2018, including demographic information pertaining to the victims, perpetrators and households impacted by those fatalities. The information is used to evaluate and modify Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) policies, guidance, best practices and procedures where warranted.

The purpose of this report is to provide information on all child fatalities that were investigated, with an emphasis on those deaths that occurred as a result of substantiated abuse or neglect. This report includes two appendices. Appendix A provides details for investigations that resulted in a founded disposition; Appendix B provides details of investigations that resulted in unfounded dispositions. A founded disposition means that a preponderance of the evidence demonstrates that child maltreatment occurred. This determination is based primarily upon first source, or direct evidence. A disposition of unfounded means there was not a preponderance of the evidence of the evidence of the evidence to warrant a founded disposition.

There are five regional Child Fatality Review Teams throughout the state. In SFY 2018, these teams conducted reviews of the child deaths, which occurred in SFY 2017; they utilize a multidisciplinary approach in these reviews.

Preliminary Summary of Findings

In SFY 2018:

- LDSS investigated 118 child deaths suspected of being caused by abuse or neglect.
- There were 40 children whose deaths were the result of abuse or neglect.
- There were 70 investigations (71 child deaths) that resulted in an unfounded disposition; seven investigations were incomplete at the time of this report.
- Fifty-seven LDSS conducted at least one child death investigation.
- The child death rate in Virginia decreased to 2.1 deaths per 100,000 children in SFY 2018. This rate is slightly below the national death rate of 2.3 deaths per 100,000 children.
- The Eastern Region investigated the most child deaths (49). While the Western Region experienced the highest rate of child deaths (3.8 deaths per 100,000 children).
- Children who died as a result of abuse or neglect ranged in age from birth to 17 years with more than 76% who were three and under.

- More male children (29) died from abuse or neglect than female children (11).
- The race of the children who died as a result of abuse or neglect included 50% who were White; 45% who were African American; 2.5% who were multi-racial, and one whose race was unknown.
- Fifty-six caretakers were determined to be responsible for the death of 40 children.
- Thirty-five of the caretakers were female and 20 were male. The gender of one caretaker was unknown.
- Sixty-six percent (66%) of the 56 caretakers were biological parents, and 31 (55%) of them were less than 30 years of age.
- Twenty-five (63%) of the 40 abuse-or-neglect-related child deaths involved physical neglect, and 15 (38%) child deaths involved physical abuse. Some children died from more than one type of abuse and/or in combination with physical neglect or medical neglect.
- Ten children were removed and placed into foster care in six households out of the 23 families who had other children in the home at the time of the child death.
- There were 40 households where child deaths were found to be caused by abuse or neglect; 24 families (60%) had prior or active child welfare involvement.

Noteworthy Trends

The percent of children who were age three and under and died as a result of abuse or neglect decreased twelve percent from SFY 2016. The percent of families who had prior child welfare involvement increased eight percent from SFY 2017. There was a fourteen percent increase from SFY 2016 in caretakers who were female.

I. CHILD DEATHS

LDSS conducted 117 investigations involving 118 child deaths suspected of being caused by child maltreatment in SFY 2018. LDSS determined that 40 children died as a result of abuse or neglect; 71 children were in unfounded reports; and seven reports were pending at the time of this report.

The Eastern Region investigated the most reports (49) followed by Northern (27), Piedmont (16), Central (13) and Western (13).

As highlighted in Table 1, 57 (48%) of the 120 LDSS investigated at least one child death. Chesapeake (10), Norfolk (9) and Newport News (8) had the highest number of investigations, not all of which were founded.

As exhibited in Table 2, the percentages of **founded** versus **unfounded** dispositions involving child fatalities decreased for founded (34%) and increased slightly for unfounded (60%) dispositions. The percentage of **all** investigations in SFY 2018 was approximately 37% founded and 62% unfounded.¹

As shown in Table 3, the death rate for children who died from abuse or neglect decreased from SFY 2017. According to the National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) 2017 <u>Child Maltreatment Report</u> the national estimate of child deaths due to maltreatment has increased 11% since FFY 2013. While there are fluctuations from year to year, the increase is attributed to the implementation of child death reviews, expansion of the scope of existing reviews as well as consultation of data sources outside of Child Protective Services (CPS). Due to the relatively low frequency of child fatalities, the national rate is sensitive to which states report this data and changes in the child population estimates produced by the U. S. Census Bureau.²

The *Code of Virginia*, specifically § 63.2-1505 B5, grants certain exceptions to completing child death investigations, which require reports or records that are generated outside of the local department, such as an autopsy report. The time needed to obtain these reports or records is not counted towards the 45/60/90 day timeframes. The records must be necessary to complete the investigation and not available due to circumstances beyond the control of the local department. In SFY 2018, this accounted for seven pending investigations.

As highlighted in Table 4, the Eastern Region conducted the most investigations of child fatalities. The percentage of founded versus unfounded child death investigations varied by region, as well as the percentage of founded versus unfounded in *all* investigations.³

VDSS also reports by region the ratio of child deaths to the population of children less than 18 years of age, as well as examines the number of child deaths and the percentages of founded investigations.

As exhibited in Table 5, the rate of child deaths per 100,000 children has increased in the Eastern Region since SFY 2016; the Western Region continues to have the highest rate. It should be noted that an increase of one or two child deaths would have a more significant impact on regions with a low child population (i.e. the Western Region) versus a region with a high child population (i.e. the Eastern Region).

II. CHILDREN

LDSS investigated the deaths of 118 children in SFY 2018; and 40 children were found to have died as a result of abuse or neglect. This section provides detailed demographic information and trends for the children involved in child death investigations and whose deaths were determined to be caused by abuse or neglect.

As highlighted in Table 6, children from birth to three years continue to be the most vulnerable to die from abuse or neglect. Virginia's percentage for SFY 2018 was 76%, which is slightly higher than the percentage throughout the country. Nationally, 72% of all child fatalities in FFY 2018 were children younger than three years of age.⁴

As shown in Table 7, there were significantly more male child deaths than female ones in SFY 2018. This is consistent with the national data which indicates that boys experienced a higher fatality rate (2.68 per 100,000) than girls (2.02 per 100,000).⁵

As exhibited in Table 8, 50% of the child fatalities in Virginia were White and 45% were African-American. The disproportionate rate of African-American child deaths in Virginia (more than 2 times) is consistent with the national data (more than 2 times).⁶

III. CARETAKERS

CPS investigates child fatalities that are suspicious for abuse or neglect committed by a caretaker **only**. Caretakers include childcare providers who are both regulated (licensed) and unregulated (unlicensed).

As shown in Table 9, LDSS determined that there were 56 caretakers responsible for the deaths of 40 children due to abuse or neglect in SFY 2018. Seventeen victims were abused or neglected by two different caretakers and two victims were abused or neglected by three different caretakers. The majority of caretakers (66%) were the biological parents, which is below the national data (80%) that indicates the parents acted alone, together or with other individuals.

Nationally, perpetrators without a parental relationship to the child accounted for 15.2%.⁷ The identity of two caretakers was unknown. Unknown is used when an investigation reveals that the child was physically abused or neglected, but the LDSS is unable to establish the identity of the responsible caretaker. If new information is received regarding the identity of the caretaker, a new investigation may be conducted.

As highlighted in Table 10, the race of the majority of caretakers was White (50%), which is consistent with previous years.

As shown in Table 11, there are typically more female perpetrators of child maltreatment than male perpetrators.

As exhibited in Table 12, the ages of caretakers ranged from 18 to 58 years in SFY 2018. The majority of the caretakers (50%) were between 20 and 29 years of age.

IV. CATEGORIES OF ABUSE AND NEGLECT

In SFY 2018, 40 children died as a result of at least one type of abuse or neglect. Some children were abused or neglected in more than one way and by more than one caretaker. Of the children who died, 22 (55%) had been physically neglected and 15 (38%) had been physically abused. Three (8%) children were medically neglected.

The type of abuse or neglect is not necessarily the *cause of death* for the child. For example, a child accidentally, fatally shot himself. The cause of death (determined by the medical examiner) would be gunshot wound of the head; the type of abuse or neglect (determined by CPS) would be neglect (failing to do something on behalf of the child).

As highlighted in Table 13, 25 (63%) of the child deaths involved some type of physical neglect. The most prevalent type of neglect was Other/Unspecified sub-type. When determining the validity of a report, the alleged inaction by the caretaker may not clearly fit into the pre-defined sub-categories but still encompasses physical neglect so the Other/Unspecified sub-type is utilized by the LDSS.

There were four gun-related deaths that were founded for physical neglect; three of them specifically for inadequate supervision

Medical neglect directly caused or contributed to the death of three (8%) children. Medical neglect involves a caretaker's failure to obtain a child's necessary medical care or to follow doctor-recommended medical regimen for the child. See the Table of Founded Child Deaths in **Appendix A** for further details.

As illustrated in Table 14, 15 (38%) children died as a result of physical abuse in SFY 2018.

V. FAMILIES AND THE CHILD WELFARE SYSTEM

When initiating a response to a child fatality report, CPS conducts an assessment of immediate harm or threat of harm toward any sibling(s) or other child(ren) in the home. Based on this initial safety assessment, a safety plan may be developed with the family for a course of action to mitigate any danger(s) or threat(s) of harm. The following information identifies those families and the resulting protective action taken by the LDSS.

As shown in Table 15, there were 40 households that involved 40 child death investigations resulting in founded dispositions for SFY 2018; 23 (58%) of those households had other children for whom initial safety was assessed. All of the remaining households had no other children in the home.

In SFY 2018, a plan was developed with five households that allowed the siblings to remain in their own home. An additional 12 households were able to develop a safety plan with the LDSS that allowed the siblings to remain with relatives, while remaining in the legal custody of the caretakers. LDSS assessed siblings living in six households as unsafe and therefore removed ten children by placing them in foster care.

As a result of CPS involvement, families were provided services to include: grief counseling; burial assistance; parent education and mental health services; substance use assessments and treatment; intimate partner violence services; protective orders and Family Partnership Meetings (FPM). Family Partnership Meetings are usually held when a child is at serious risk of being removed or removed from the home. These meetings present an opportunity for family and community participation in the decision making process for children.

As exhibited in Table 16, there were 40 victims (40 households) in founded CPS fatality investigations for SFY 2018; 24 families (60.0%) had prior or active child welfare involvement. Six families were active with the LDSS at the time of the fatality.

Some families had prior history in more than one locality

Prior involvement means that the abuser, victim or siblings were previously the subject of a family assessment, an investigation or an ongoing service or foster care case. It does not include any caretaker's history of abuse or neglect that occurred as a child or any reports of suspected child abuse or neglect that did not meet validity criteria.

Prior involvement also includes any open family assessment, investigation or case at the time of the child's death. It may also have occurred in more than one locality or a locality different from where the child died. The following summarizes the prior or current child welfare involvement of the families with founded fatality victims:

- **1. Prince William:** In June 2015, a report was completed for physical neglect by the mother involving the sibling of the deceased child. The investigation was founded; services were not provided.
- 2. Virginia Beach: In September 2017, a report was received for physical abuse by the father involving the deceased child; it was open at the time of death.
- **3.** Warren Co.: In January 2016, a report was received for a substance-exposed infant (the deceased child). Services were needed and provided.
- **4. Henrico Co.:** From February to November 2015, prevention services were provided to the decedent's older sibling. In April 2017, a report was received for physical abuse by the stepfather involving the decedent. Services were recommended and provided.
- **5.** Roanoke City: In July 2015, a report was received for medical neglect by the mother involving one of the deceased child's siblings. Services were recommended. In August 2017, a report was received for substance-exposed infant (the deceased child). Services were recommended and obtained.
- 6. Wise Co.: In December 2016, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother involving the older sibling of the deceased child. Services were not needed. In February 2017, there was an investigation for physical neglect by the mother involving the deceased child's older sibling. The investigation was founded and services were provided.
- **7. Gloucester Co.:** From 2016 to 2017, two reports were received for physical neglect by the mother and the father. Services were not needed. In March 2017, there was an investigation for physical neglect by both the mother and father. The investigation was founded and services were provided.
- 8. Norfolk: In August 2016, a report was received for sexual abuse by a maternal uncle involving the decedent. The report was founded and no services were provided (the uncle was incarcerated).

- **9. Petersburg:** In October 2017, there was an investigation for physical neglect by the mother involving the deceased child and siblings. The investigation was founded and services were provided.
- **10. Orange:** In January 2018, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother and stepfather involving the deceased child and was pending at the time of death.
- **11. Pulaski:** In February 2015, a report was received for physical neglect by the parents involving the deceased child. Services were not needed. In August 2016, there was an investigation for physical abuse by the mother involving the decedent. The safety plan was not followed and the deceased child was placed into foster care; the investigation was founded. In November 2016, there was an investigation for physical neglect by the parents involving the deceased child and younger sibling. Both were removed and placed into foster care; the investigation was founded Services were provided before and after the children returned home.
- **12. Giles Co.:** In December 2014, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother involving the deceased child. Services were not needed.
- **13. Amherst Co.:** In December 2016, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother involving the decedent's older sibling. The investigation was founded and services were provided.
- **14. Montgomery Co.:** In October 2017, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother involving the decedent's older sibling. Services were needed and provided. In December 2017, a report was received for a substance-exposed infant (the deceased child). Services were provided and was open at the time of death.
- **15. Henrico Co.:** In March 2018, a report was received for sexual abuse by the maternal uncle involving the decedent's older sibling and was open at the time of death.
- **16. Virginia Beach:** In March 2013, a report was received for neglect and abuse involving the mother's paramour and his sons. The investigation was founded, the paramour was incarcerated and services were provided.
- **17. Hampton:** In February 2018, a report was received for a substance-exposed infant (the deceased child). Services were initiated, but then the family relocated.
- **18. Newport News:** In March 2018, a report was received for physical neglect by the mother involving the deceased child; it was open at the time of death.
- **19. Henrico Co.:** In November 2013, services were provided as the result of a report for a substance-exposed infant (the deceased child).
- **20. Out of State:** In February 2018, there was a report for physical neglect by the mother involving the older sibling of the deceased child. A second report was made a month later involving the deceased child. During the safety planning, the parents left with the children and did not return; it was later learned that they were traveling to Virginia.
- **21. Franklin Co:** In February 2006, services were provided to the maternal grandmother involving the older sibling of the deceased child.
- **22. Norfolk:** In February 2018, a report was received for medical neglect by the mother involving the deceased child. The investigation was unfounded; services were needed and obtained.
- **23. Montgomery Co.:** In January 2018, a report was received for neglect (medical) by the mother involving the decedent. Services were not needed
- **24. Henry Co.:** From 2014 to 2016, two reports were received for neglect by the maternal grandmother and the mother involving the decedent and the decedent's younger sibling, services were not needed. In December 2016, a report was received for neglect by the

mother involving the decedent's younger sibling. The investigation was unfounded and services were provided.

25. Norfolk: In January 2013, a report was received for neglect by the parents involving one of the decedent's siblings (who also died). The investigation was unfounded.

VI. UNFOUNDED REPORTS

In SFY 2018 there were 70 (59%) child fatality investigations with an unfounded disposition. One investigation was for two child deaths; therefore, there were a total of 71 reports. An unfounded disposition does not mean the abuse or neglect did not occur. An unfounded disposition means the investigation lacked a preponderance of the evidence to warrant a disposition of founded.

Of the 71 unfounded reports:

- Fifty-three of the reports (75%) involved a child less than one year of age.
- Thirty of the 71 reports (42%) were sleep-related. This means the actual surface the child slept on, with whom the child was sleeping, or how the child was sleeping. This includes children who suffocated or accidently asphyxiated due to their sleep environment.

Many of the sleep-related child deaths resulted in a determination by a medical examiner that the cause of death was Sudden Unexplained Infant Death (SUID). SUID is a diagnosis of exclusion, made when there is an absence of pathological findings revealing injury, violence, disease, or other fatal medical condition. A SUID diagnosis recognizes a host of confounding factors, most importantly, the presence of unsafe sleep factors and/or medical problems such as pneumonia, prematurity or congestion⁵.

VII. NEAR-FATALITIES

CAPTA (Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act) defines a "near fatality" *as an act that, as certified by a physician, places the child in serious or critical condition* (22VAC40-705-10) "Life-threatening condition" means a condition that if left untreated, more likely than not will result in death and for which the recommended medical treatments carry a probable chance of impairing the health of the individual or a risk of terminating the life of the individual.

There were 12 near-fatalities reported and investigated by LDSS for possible abuse or neglect. Eight of the 12 children were under the age of one; the other four children were one, two, two and 17 years old. Sixty-seven percent (8) of the children were male and 33% female. The race of the children was 58% White; 33% African-American and the race of one child was unknown. Nine of the 12 investigations (75%) were founded for abuse or neglect; two of the families had prior child welfare involvement and services were needed and provided.
