 - ✓ Activities varied and age appropriate choices
 - ✓ Project-based, skill building activities
- Intentional Links to the School Day
 - ✓ Expand and enrich not duplicate school activities
 - ✓ Communicate with administration, guidance, teachers
 - ✓ Balance connection to & independence from school day
- Well Prepared Staff
 - ✓ Committed and caring
 - ✓ Positive role models
 - ✓ Staff who connect with youth
 - ✓ Professional development opportunities
- Development of Social/Life Skills
 - ✓ Evidence-based prevention programs
 - ✓ Collaborative learning, peer tutoring, character education
 - ✓ Culturally relevant and diverse programs
