



Dear Families,

You may have previously received Summer Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits based on your eligibility in the SNAP program during July or August 2022. Benefits were issued to eligible SNAP households on September 23, 2022.

P-EBT benefits are now being released to eligible SNAP households that include child(ren) who were under the age of six (6) as of September 1, 2021, were not enrolled in school and did not receive school-aged P-EBT benefits during the 2021-2022 school year. You may receive one or more allotments based upon your household's eligibility for SNAP between the time from September 2021 and June 2022. For eligible households with active SNAP cases, the benefits loaded were loaded to their existing EBT cards. Eligible households who no longer have an active SNAP case can expect to receive a new EBT card via the mail by the end of December 2022.

WHO is ELIGIBLE

- Children who were under 6 as of September 1, 2021
- Households that received regular SNAP benefits between September 2021-June 2022
- Child(ren) not enrolled in school during the 2021-2022 school year

WHO is NOT ELIGIBLE

- Children enrolled in school during the 2021-2022 school year
- Children who turned 6 during the school year **and** enrolled in school anytime during the school year
- Children whose household only received P-EBT benefits from September 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022

WHAT

- Each eligible child will receive a one-time monthly benefit of:
- \$32.91 for each month of regular SNAP eligibility, for the months of September – December, 2021
- \$28.93 for each month of regular SNAP eligibility, for the months of January – June, 2022

WHEN

- Eligible households who no longer have an active SNAP case can expect to receive a new EBT card via the mail by the end of December 2022.

WHERE

- For active SNAP cases, P-EBT benefits will automatically be added to existing EBT cards
- For eligible households whose case has closed at the time of P-EBT issuance, those benefits will be added to a new P-EBT benefit card and be mailed to the address on file
