



## MEDICATION ROUTES

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<b>Routes certified to administer with a valid MAT Certificate</b>	<b>Routes not certified to administer with a valid MAT Certificate*</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Oral</li><li>• Inhaled</li><li>• Topical</li><li>• Medicated Patches</li><li>• Eye</li><li>• Ear</li><li>• Epinephrine via auto injector device (only when prescribed to a specific child for treatment of anaphylaxis)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Injections (except epinephrine using an auto injector device when prescribed for a specific child as treatment for anaphylaxis)</li><li>• Rectal</li><li>• Vaginal</li></ul>

\*These medication routes are not covered in the MAT course. MAT certified child care providers may be able to administer medication by routes not covered in the MAT course to a child with special health care needs. There must be an individualized health care plan which identifies any special training or skills the child care provider(s) must have before giving medication by a route not covered in the MAT course.
