



Participant Pre-Demonstration Practice Scenario

Alan Barth is a four-year-old child who attends your program full time (Monday- Friday). He has a history of extremely high fevers causing seizures. Alan's mother knows that she must come to the program to take Alan home if he has a temperature over 101°; however, she doesn't want him to have to wait to receive medication until she arrives. His physician has given you written instructions to give him Children's Strength Liquid Tylenol® if he has a temperature over 101°F. His mother gave you the attached Written Medication Consent Form two weeks ago.

Today is 2/4/05. At 8:30am Alan's mother quickly drops him off and doesn't mention if he received any Tylenol® today and you did not ask. She did tell you that Alan seemed tired this morning but was otherwise fine.

It is now 10:10am and he has started crying and seems irritable. You touch him and he feels hot. You decide to take his temperature. Alan is unable to hold the thermometer in his mouth, so an axillary temperature is taken. It is 102°F. Use the attached Written Medication Consent Form and Log of Medication Administration to give Alan Barth his medication.
