Carroll County provides a system of services to the general public, high risk groups, and individual families. Carroll utilizes volunteers to provide some of its prevention services. They also use Family Partnership meetings (FPMs) in early prevention. The staff facilitates alternate living arrangements with relatives or non-relatives for a child at risk of removal and entering foster care (Foster Care Diversion). They also directly provide services to any of the 'diversion families' and/or birth families involved after they have facilitated an informal out of home alternative living arrangement

Carroll County has specific staff devoted primarily to prevention for universal early prevention services. They also provide early prevention services to high risk groups and individual families.
