SUBJECT: Licensing Waivers During Virginia's State of Emergency-COVID-19

The Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Social Services, in accordance with Executive Orders issued by the Governor during the COVID-19 Pandemic, has authorized temporary regulatory and operational flexibility for the Division of Licensing Programs through the end of the state of emergency for requirements that are burdensome to comply with during the pandemic.

Effective immediately, the Division of Licensing will adopt waivers and modifications for some licensing requirements in response to COVID-19. A list of leniency items is approved pursuant to Executive Order Fifty-One, the state of emergency issued for the Commonwealth on March 12, 2020. The waivers are effective for the duration of the declared state of emergency and providers are expected to comply with all requirements once the state of emergency has ended.

Leniency is granted in areas including:

- Documentation and training/orientation
- Heath records
- Staff/children records
- Provider and staff qualifications
- Prelicensure and subsequent inspections and approvals
- Equipment, materials, and activities
- Background checks
- Operational requirements including capacity, terms of license or certificate, etc.

If an on-site inspection is necessary while the Emergency Protocols are in effect, Licensing staff will take steps to limit exposure to individuals when conducting the onsite inspection and follow the <u>Temporary Procedures for Conducting Licensing</u> <u>Inspections</u>.
