Steps to Apply for an Initial Family Day Home License

To assist you in navigating the licensing process, licensing representatives are a valuable resource and will work closely with new applicants: from pre-application through to licensure. We want you to support your success in operating a child care program.

- 3. View online Phase I training---*recommended* http://www.dss.virginia.gov/facility/child_care/licensed/fdh/articulate/phase1/player.html
- 4. Contact your VDSS licensing office to schedule Phase II training.
- 5. Contact your local zoning office to determine the number of children you may request to care for in your home.
- 6. Complete your initial family day home application and gather the required attachments. NOTE: Background checks must be completed within 90 days prior to submitting an application. Original background checks *MUST* be available at the home for inspection.
- 7. Attend Phase II training. Come with any questions you may have.

8. Submit your completed application to your VDSS licensing office. A complete application package includes the application, all required attachments, and fee made out to "Treasurer of Virginia." NOTE: A complete application must be submitted at least 60 days prior to the family day home's planned opening date. Submission of an incomplete application will delay the review process.

A licensing inspector will contact you regarding your application and guide you through the rest of the application process.
