

**EMERGENCY ESCAPE PLAN
(MODEL FORM)**

1. PLAN YOUR ESCAPE ROUTE AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES.
2. DISCUSS THIS WITH OTHER CAREGIVERS.
3. PRACTICE YOUR ESCAPE PLAN on a monthly basis to the point of exit from the home.

USE THESE GRIDS TO DRAW A FLOOR PLAN AND ESCAPE ROUTE FOR EACH FLOOR IN THE HOUSE WHERE CHILDREN ARE IN CARE

A large rectangular grid consisting of 20 columns and 15 rows of squares. This grid is intended for drawing a floor plan and an escape route for one of the floors in the house.

A second large rectangular grid, identical to the one above, consisting of 20 columns and 15 rows of squares. This grid is intended for drawing a floor plan and an escape route for another floor in the house.
