**Kinship Update** – Carl Ayers provided an update on Kinship.

**Update from ALF Liability Insurance Committee** – Sheryl Garland provided the Board an update from the ALF Liability Insurance Committee. The committee set forth a plan, recommending the agency monitor the implementation of the emergency regulation for negative operational or fiscal impacts by tier, and the amount of liability insurance obtained by tier, with the possibility of seeking guidance from the Secretary of Health & Human Resources. These recommendations are to be on the April 2025 meeting agenda for a vote. After some discussion on whether facilities are currently complying with the emergency regulation to have the required liability insurance, the agency was asked to survey facilities for verification of such insurance. The Board will be notified of the survey results. It was also agreed that a draft proposed regulation will be available for discussion at the April 2025 meeting, and a proposed regulation will potentially be adopted at the June 2025 meeting.

**Update from Bylaws Committee** – Don Carey provided the Board an update from the Bylaws Committee. He put forth three topics on which the committee had not been able to come to consensus. They include increasing the number of allowable virtual meetings from two to three, the ability of the Chair to put forth motions and to vote, and Board's role in advocacy. Ms. Short noted that the bylaws document in general has not been updated in some time, and needs updating overall.

After some discussion, there was consensus to amending the bylaws to allow for the third virtual meeting in a calendar year. There was consensus to amending the bylaws to allow the chair to weigh in on measures and vote, with parameters in place. Regarding advocacy, Ms. Fulmer explained the Office of Attorney General continues to review this matter. The committee will bring draft amendments for Board discussion to a future meeting.

**2025 Board Meeting Locations** – Mr. Carey and members discussed having a 2025 meeting outside of the Richmond area. Commissioner Williams offered to come back to the Board with recommendations after staff survey local offices in Southwest VA.

### **Board Member Comments**

Ms. Santos mentioned immigrant communities and how recent legislation might impact how families reach out and are served. Commissioner Williams noted an earlier presentation to the Board on the topic that might be updated to address her concerns.

Mr. Carey referenced an email he received in February 2024 from a constituent concerned that the agency violated the foster care bill of rights. He asked Commissioner Williams to provide an update on the concern via email.
